Patterns: Drawing refers to half width, indication of stitch number to whole width of each part.




If the central line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is done simultaneously with reversed shapings.

If the central line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is done separately with reversed shapings.

Stitch size: These numbers are recommended by us, but must be controlled by means of a test square, knitted on your machine with your wool.

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter).

The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i.e. to all needles which are in Working Position on front and back bed.

Exception: For tubular, the necessary stitches are only given for one bed, on the other bed, the same number of needles has to be put into Working position. In these cases, the sign for tubular  $\bigcirc$  respectively halftubular  $\text{C}$  or  $\text{C}$  is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

- + 3 × 2 • 8 . R** means: 3 times incr. 2 stitches in every 8th row ( 1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- 19 × 3 • 7 . R** means: 19 times decr. 3 stitches in every 7th row ( 2 stitches at back, 1 stitch at front and vice versa)
- 17 × 1 • 2 / 3 . R** means: 17 times decr. 1 stitch, alternately after 2 rows and 3 rows.
- ▲ - 4 × 8 • 2 . R** means: work with pushers and knit graduations (Lock BX). Gradually after every 2nd row return 8 pushers into Rest Position (for double bed work 4 pushers each on back and front bed). When all graduations are finished, put pushers into Neutral Position and knit normally with all needles and without pushers.

Number of stitches and inches:

- 136 = 8"** means: a total of 136 stitches (for K/K 68 stitches each on front and back) make a width of 8".
- 0 146 = 17"** means: cast on 146 stitches each on front and back for tubular which makes a width of 17 ins.

Test square and PASSAP chart

If you always knit 100 stitches and 100 rows for your test square, you save the trouble of counting rows and stitches and can read any desired measurement in our PASSAP chart (at the end of this book).

Horizontally: Across the top you will find the measurements in inches of your test square of 100 stitches and 100 rows; range from 4" to 20", split up in two charts.

Vertically: Required measurements in inches for your garment. From top to bottom, on the left and right, you will find the number of inches measured for your garment. These numbers range from 1/2" to 40" on each chart.

Example: 100 stitches of your test square measure, say, 10". For your garment, however, you need a width of, say, 8". Look in the horizontal column under 10" and in the vertical column under 8". Where both columns meet you find the number 80, i.e. you have to cast on 80 stitches (40 on each bed).

In the same way you find the desired number of rows on the chart. Numbers for measurements, which you do not find on the chart, you may obtain by a simple addition.

How to divide the work: Knit stitches, which should temporarily rest, like a buttonhole, with contrast yarn. Put the needles into Neutral Position. Thus you obtain long loops, which hold the stitches. Later on you just have to unravel the contrast yarn and the stitches will slip back to their needle heads.

PASSAP 12: Each model can also be done on PASSAP 12, if you choose a PASSAP 12 pattern. - Fairisle patterns can be done on PASSAP 12 with heel deckers, which are available at any PASSAP dealer.

Size: 1 1/2 to 2 years.

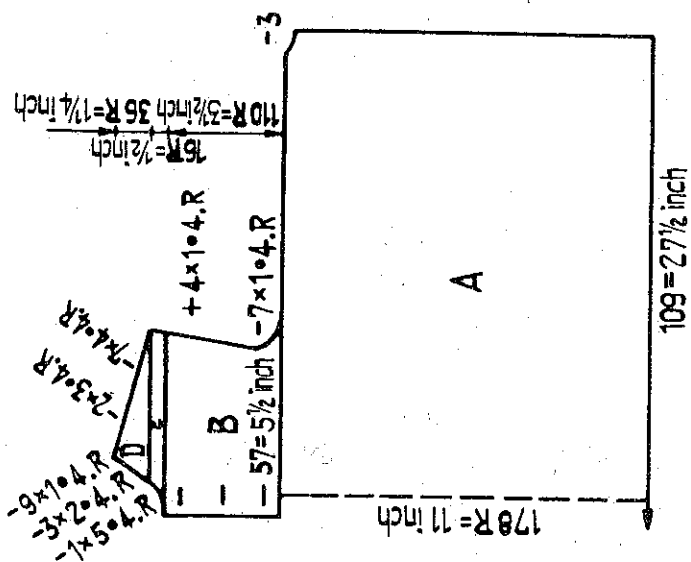
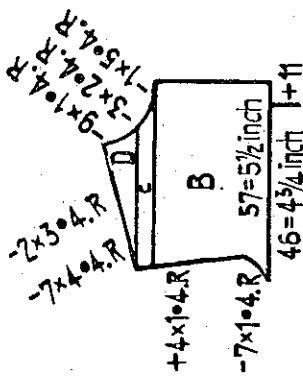
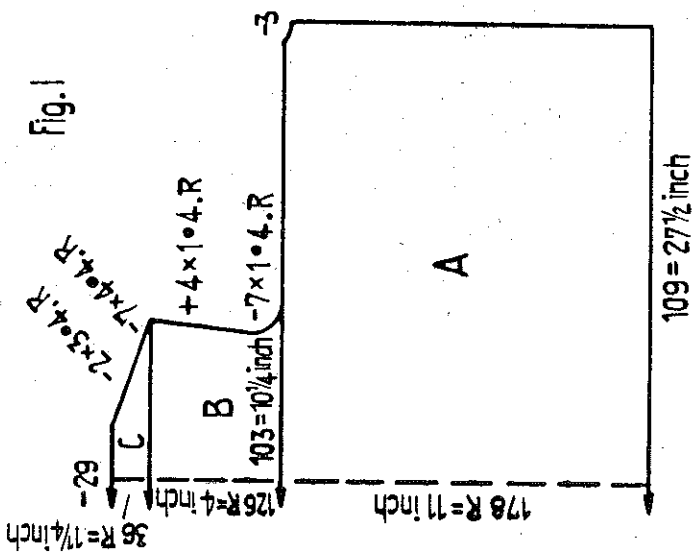
Materials: 7 ozs. medium babywool white, 3 small buttons, approx. 80 ins. silk ribbon  
Stitch size: hem 4, stocking stitch and pattern 5, 1:1 rib 2.  
Test square: st.st. 100 sts = 13 ins. 100 rows = 9 1/2 ins.  
Pattern: knit according to diagram. X = 1 pusher in Rest Position.



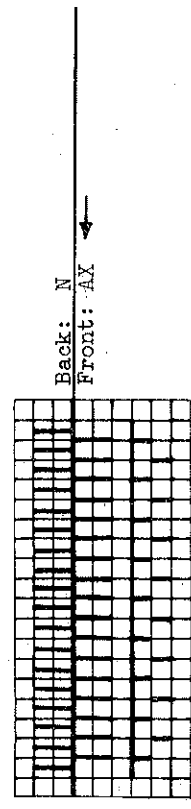

Fig. I: A = hem, st.st. B = transfer all sts to back bed, pattern. C = transfer all sts to front bed, st.st. D = hang sts together as follows: 1st and 2 sts, 2nd and 3 sts a.s.o., then transfer all sts to back bed, pattern. E = divide work, then transfer all sts to front bed, st.st., after 22 rows work an open work row. Fig. II: A to D = work as for Fig. I. E = transfer all sts to front bed, st.st., after 22 rows work an open work row. Fig. III: A = 1:1, after 5 rows work an open work row. B = transfer all sts to back bed, pattern. C = transfer all sts to front bed, st.st., after 22 rows work an open work row. To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Crochet 1 row of firm sts around neck and back-opening, making 3 loops on right part. Attach buttons. At neck and sleeves pull silk ribbon through the open work row.

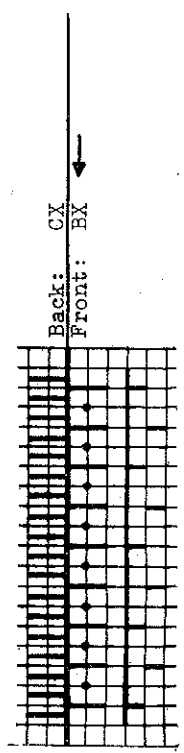

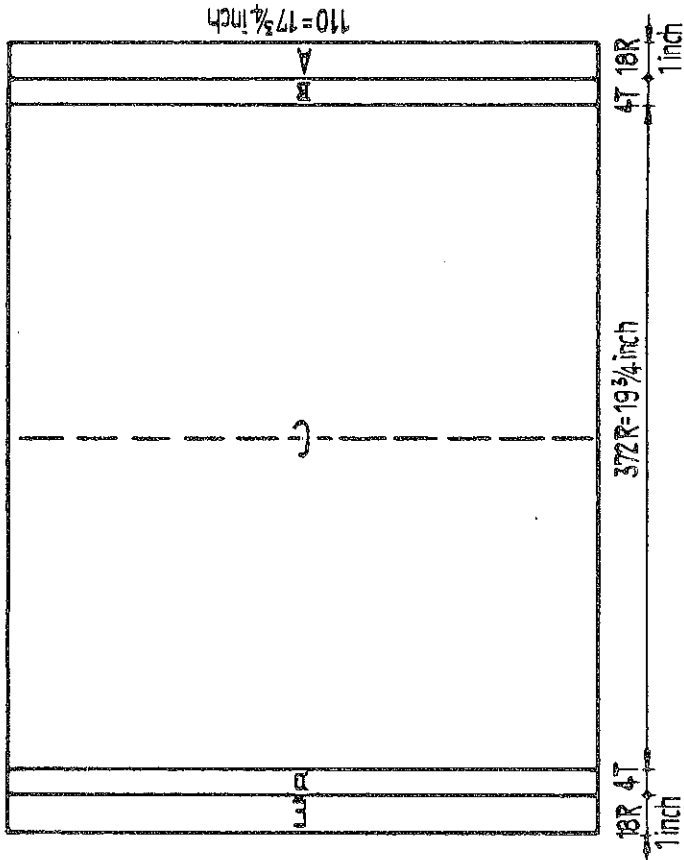

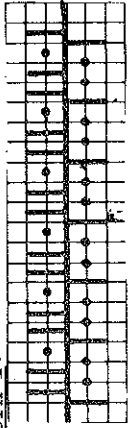
Special note: Exceptionally the indications refer to the sts of the back bed only. On front bed put nds in or out of work as required. By passing from pattern I to pattern II the bodice of the dress becomes automatically narrower.

 Figure II: A = pattern I. B = divide work, so that 57 sts remain on the right and 47 sts on the left. Pattern II. On the right part work buttonholes as follows: in the 40th, 70th and 100th row over the 6th to 8th nds C and D = pattern II.  
 Figure III: A = K/R. B and C = pattern I.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew left part of front opening under the right part, then with angora wool crochet 2 rows of firm sts around neck and front opening. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons.

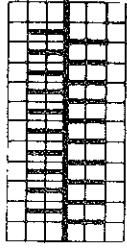

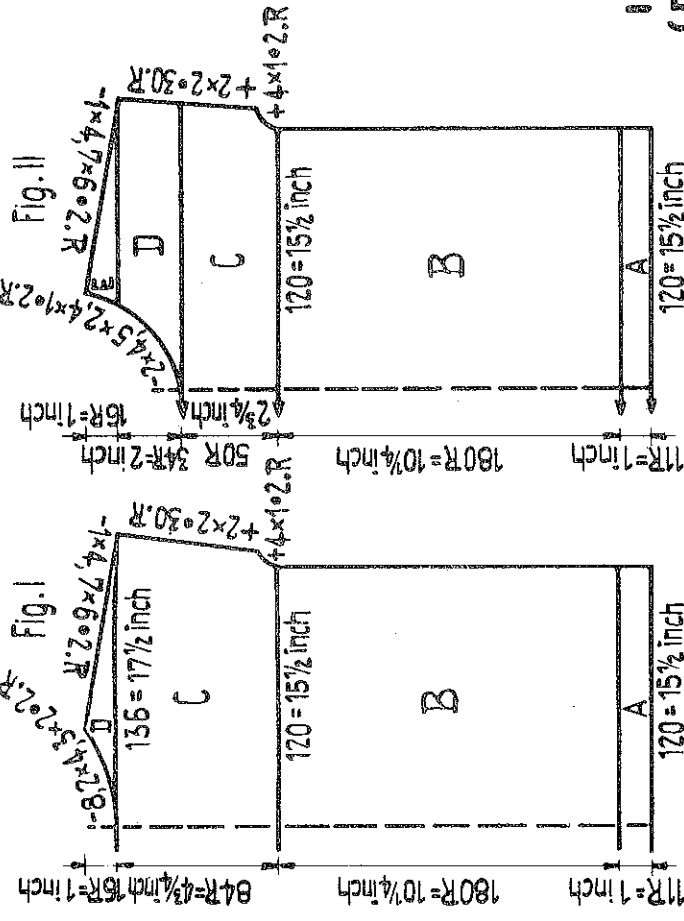

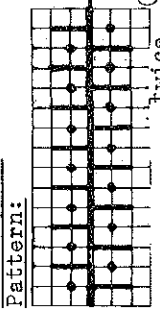

Stitch both knitted sideparts into position, starting at the upper edge leaving free tubular knitting and round off the lower edges. Fold half inside and slip stitch both upper edges of bag. Now sew on the lining at the lower edge of tubular knitting and lateral at the upper edge of sideparts. Attach hoop.

**Pattern:** stocking stitch. For raglan shaping hang the 5th st onto the 6th rd and follow up with 4 sts.  
**Figure I:** A = 1:1. B and C = st.st.  
**Figure II:** A = 1:1. B and C = st.st. D = divide work, st.st.  
**Figure III:** A = 1:1. B and C = st.st.  
**Neckborder:** cast on 90 sts in 1:1 and knit 9 rows. Now bring all ends into W.P. and knit 8 rows tubular. With contrast wool knit 4 rows tubular and 2 rows K/X, then release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Sew neckborder together and stitch it around neck first outside with back stitch st by st, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside.

Neckborder: Cast on 160 sts in 1:1 and knit 7 rows. Now bring all nds into W.P. and knit 2 rows tubular, then with red back and front 3 rows stocking stitch, continue with 1 row back and front in st.st. With contrast wool knit 4 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release. Armholeborder: knit twice. Cast on 114 sts in 1:1 and knit 7 rows. Now bring all nds into W.P. and knit 2 rows tubular. Then back and front 4 rows st.st. With contrast wool knit 4 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch borders into position first outside with back stitch st by st, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Mitre front of neckborder.

With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows N/W, then release. To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch collar into position, first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Set in zip.

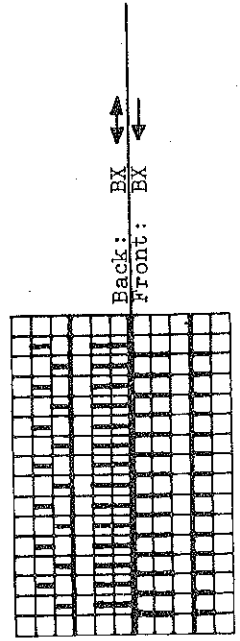

Neckborder: Hang all pieces back to the machine in 1:1 division (132 sts) and knit 38 rows in light green.

Figure XII, cap: A = 1:1 in light green. B = pattern II, work pattern diagram from top to bottom. C = hang every 7th st onto 8th nd, 16 times. D = hang every 6th st onto 7th nd, 16 times. E = hang every 5th st onto 6th nd, 18 times, then knit 1:1 in light green.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Fold all borders intohalf and slip stitch inside. Sew cap seam together and at the top pull all sts together. Trim top with pompon.

Now on front bed bring all nds into W.P. and knit 44 rows, then on back bed bring all nds into W.P. and with St.S. 5 1/2 knit 4 rows tubular and 4 rows stocking stitch on front and back bed. With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release. To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join collar, leaving a 4 ins. opening on one side. Stitch collar into position first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch in-side. Make one cord and pull through the holes in height of neck-line. At both ends of cord fix one pompon.

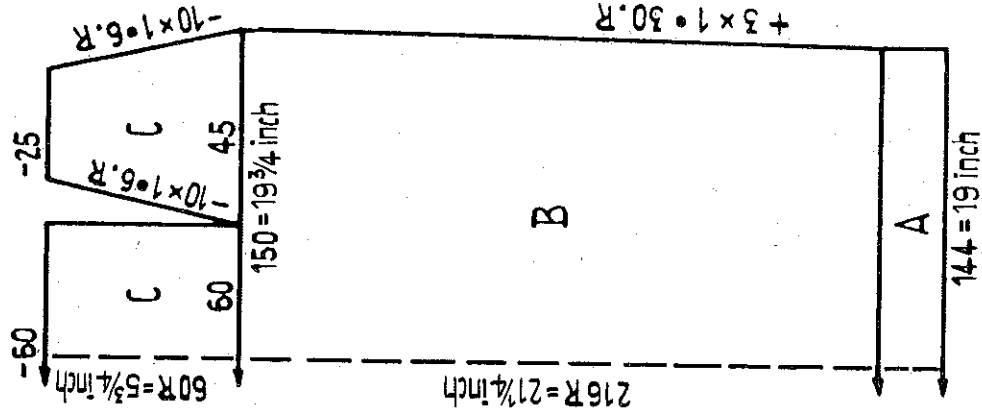
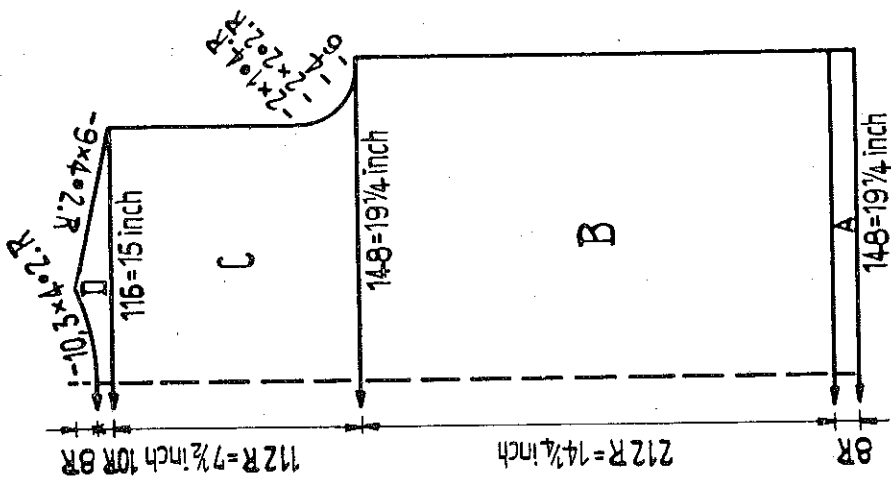


Figure III: A = 1:l. B = st.st. C = st.st., for raglan shaping work with triple decker needle.

Figure I, II, III and XII: A = red, l.l. B = pattern. C = red, l.l.  
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams, thereby leave side seams 8 3/4 ins open for armhole. Pull together the sts of top of cap, and fix tassel.

Elegant lady's cardigan  
 Size: to fit 34 to 36 inch bust. Materials: approx. 12 ozs fine sweater wool, 7 buttons  
 Stitch size: border tubular 3 1/4, pattern 2  
 Test square: 100 sts = 15 1/4 ins. 100 rows = 4 1/2 ins.  
 Pattern: back, sleeves and frontborder knit without motive.  
 Frontparts and collar knit with motive according to diagram.  
 o = on frontbed put 1 st onto next nd and leave empty nd in W.P.  
 Knit 2 rows. x = on frontbed bring nd out of work.



Back: N C X C  
 Front: CX C

Special note: Exceptionally the indications refer to the sts of the backed only. On front put nds into W.P. or N.P. as desired. Figure I and III: A = tubular. B, C and D = pattern.  
 Figure II: A = tubular. B = pattern, arrange for pattern motive at 17 sts away from frontedge. C, D and E = pattern.  
 Figure IV: A = tubular. B = at both ends take 22 sts to contrast wool, then arrange for pattern motive at 5 sts away from edge. C = tubular, then with contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/X, then release.  
 Frontborder: Cast on 24 sts (front 12/back 12 sts) and knit 400 rows in pattern, thereby after 18 rows make 1st buttonhole over the 2nd to 16th nds. Make 7 further buttonholes each after 62 rows.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch frontborders into position and finish buttonholes. Join collar edge to collar, then stitch collar into position beginning at centre of frontborder. First sew outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Attach buttons.

Baby's outfit (jacket, leggings, bonnet and gloves)  
 Size: for approx. 3 to 4 months.  
 Materials: approx. 8 ozs medium babywool white, 2 buttons, approx. 60 ins silk ribbon.  
 Stitch size: 1:1 welts 3 1/2, pattern, stocking st and tubular 5 1/2  
 Test square: Pattern. 100 sts = 6 1/4 ins. 100 rows = 8 3/4 ins.  
 Pattern I: for leggings, bonnet and gloves.

Figure IXa, back part of leggings: A, B, C = pattern I. D = 1:1, thereby after 8 rows make an open work row. E = st.st. F = divide work, st.st. G = 1:1. H = heel. J and K = st.st.  
 Figure IXb, front part of leggings: A, B, C and D = pattern I. E = 1:1, thereby after 8 rows make an open work row. F = st.st. G = divide work, st.st. H = 1:1. J and K = st.st.  
 Figure XII, bonnet: A = pattern I. B = tubular, for the decr. put 6 times the 13th st onto the 14th nd, then transfer all sts to the centre. Knit 2 rows, then repeat decr, always putting the 12th st onto the 13th nd. a.s.o.  
 Figure XIII, glove: A = pattern I. B and C = tubular, thereby in the first 2 rows make an open work row.  
 Sleeveborder: Knit twice. Cast on 12 sts and knit 30 rows st.st.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Jacket. Join sleeve seams, then stitch borders into position with pull stitch side to the outside. Fold borders into half and slip stitch inside. Along edges crochet 1 or 2 rows of firm stitches and along neckline make 1 row of double crochet. Make a cord and pull through the double crochet. Leggings. Join seams. Around upper part crochet 1 or 2 rows of firm stitches, thereby at front straps make buttonholes. At back straps attach buttons. Make cord and pull through open work row. Bonnet. Join seam for approx. 1 inch. Crochet 1 or 2 rows of firm stitches around bonnet and attach a silk ribbon at each end. Glove. Join borders and pull silk ribbon through open work row.

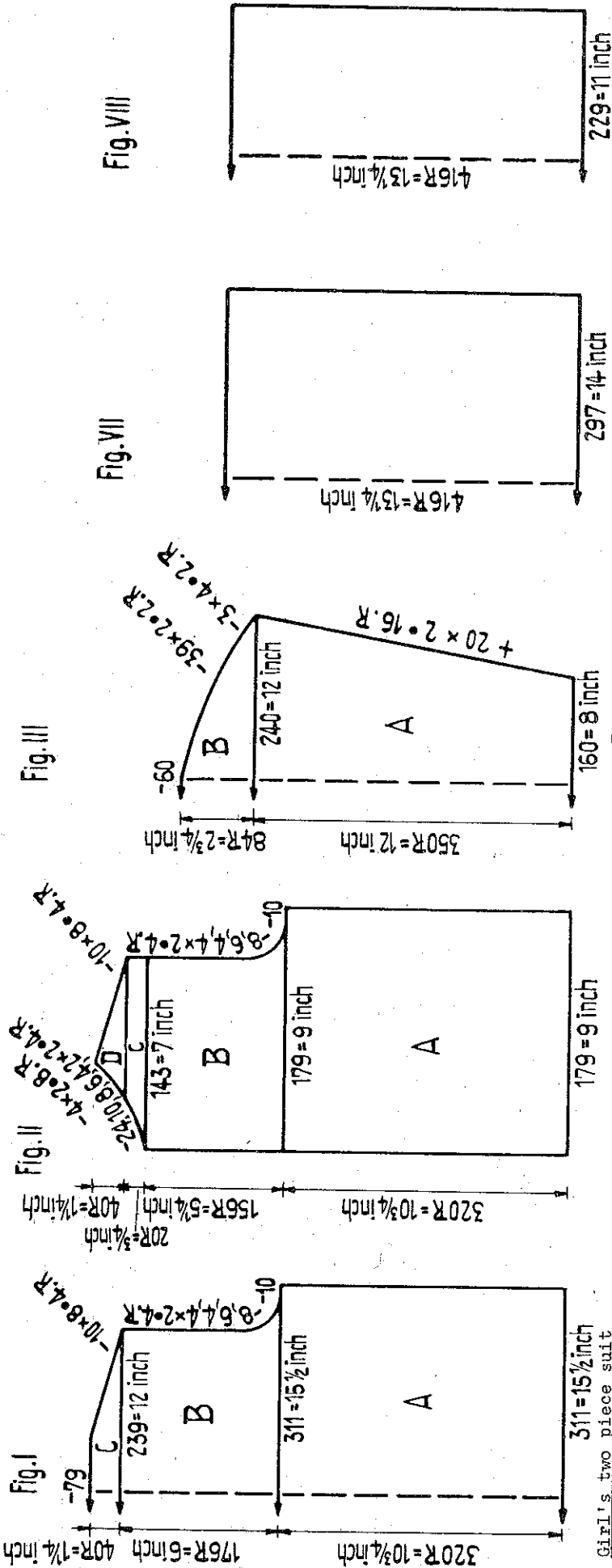


Figure I: A, B and C = pattern I.

 Figure VIII: skirt, side parts: knit twice. Work as for Fig. VII, thereby at the right on back bed bring the 40th and 41st nds with pushers, and at the left the 41st and 42nd nds with pushers into N.P. Belt: Cast on 241 sts and knit 72 rows in pattern II.  
 Frontborder: knit twice. With double wool cast on 179 sts and knit 12 rows in stocking stitch with StS 4. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Join front borders and stitch them into position st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons.  
 Skirt. Join side parts with front- and back parts, thereby pay attention to form a pleat. Sew belt into position and pull elastic through.

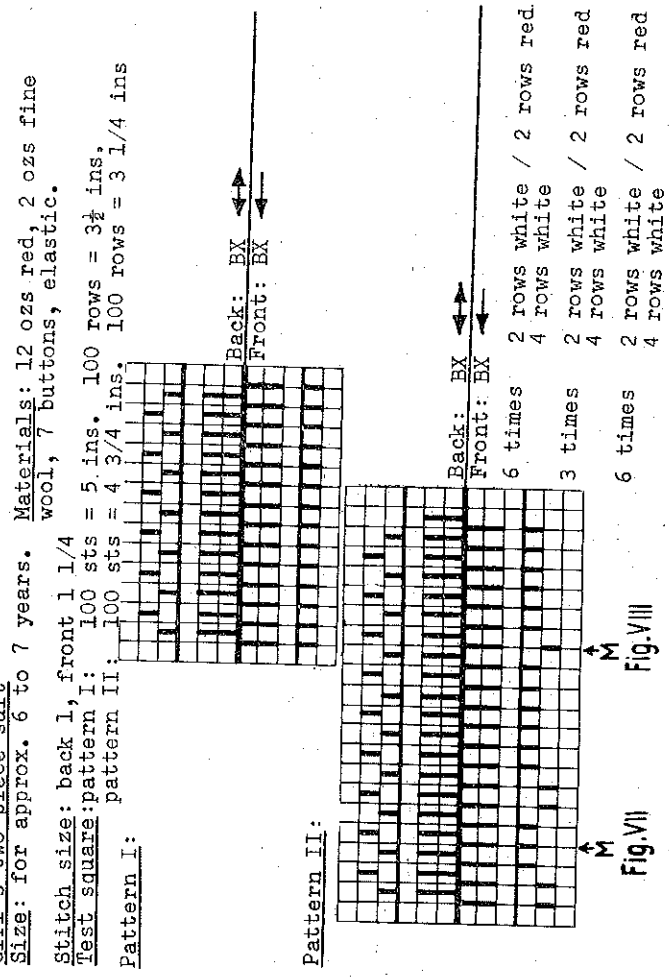

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neck border into position, first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside.

**Figure II:** A = 1:1. B = st.st. C = st.st., for raglan shaping first put the 3rd and 4th sts onto the 5th and 6th nds and follow up with the remaining 2 sts, then work with triple decker nd. D = divide work, st.st. E and F = st.st.

**Figure III:** A = 1:1. B = st.st. C = st.st., for raglan shaping first put the 3rd and 4th sts onto the 5th and 6th nds and follow up with the remaining 2 sts, then work with triple decker needle. **Neckborder:** Knit twice. Cast on 92 sts for stocking stitch and knit 10 rows with StS 4 1/2. With contrast wool knit a few rows, then release. To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborder together and stitch it into position first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Mitre front edge.

Frontborder: hang back the 10 sts from the contrast wool and knit 110 rows, thereby at the right border after 100 rows make buttonhole over the 3 centre sts. Take all sts onto contrast wool.  
 Neckborder: hang back all sts from the contrast wool to the machine (102 sts) and knit 10 rows in 1:1. After 5 rows make buttonhole over the 5th to 7th nds.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. At the jacket finish buttonholes and attach buttons. At each bonnet edge fix silk ribbon approx. 24 ins. Parts: crochet 1 row of firm sts around the whole part. Pull elastic through the tubular border and fix elastic at each end with one button. At each end of strap (silk ribbon, approx. 24 ins long) make small hem and attach one button. Pull strap through the 4 centre sts of Section A (back) and buttoning with Section D (frontpart).

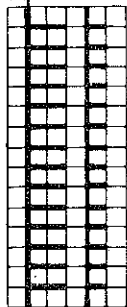

Figure II: A = knit over 62 sts in 1:1 and transfer the remaining 18 sts to back bed. Sts front 2, back 6. After 7 rows make 1st buttonhole over the 4th to 6th and 13th to 15th nds. B = stocking

stitch, on back knit the 18 sts for border with StS 6. At the 13th, 32nd, 52nd, 72nd and 92nd rows make buttonholes each as in Section A. C = st. st., for raglan shaping work as for Fig. I, for neck shaping put the 19th st onto the 20th nd and follow up with the remaining 18 sts. D = stocking stitch. C = stocking stitch, for raglan shaping work as for Fig. I.  
To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch front borders together sew them on around back neck. Fold border into half and slip stitch inside. Finish buttonholes and attach buttons.

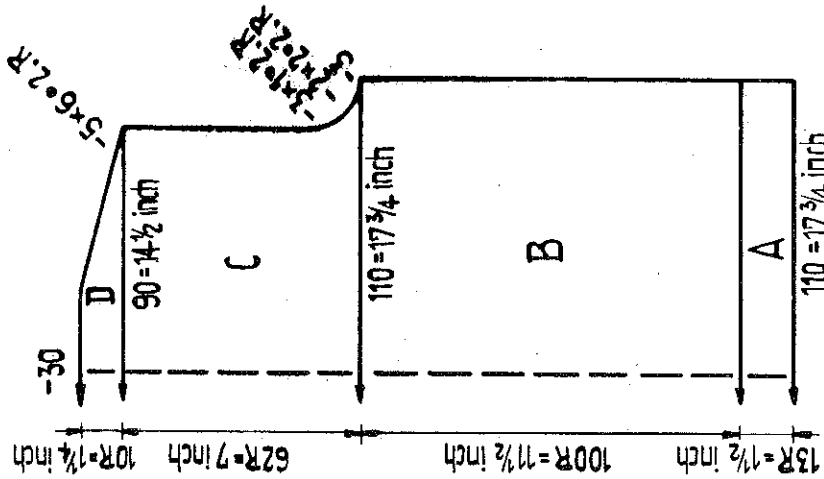

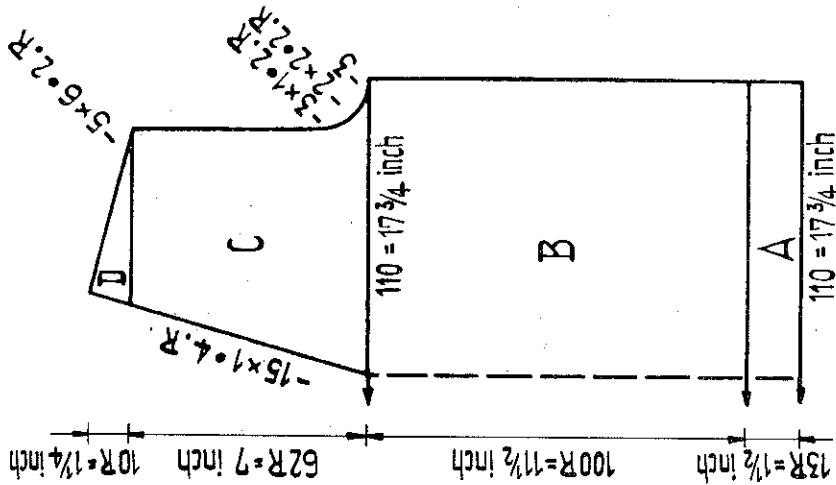
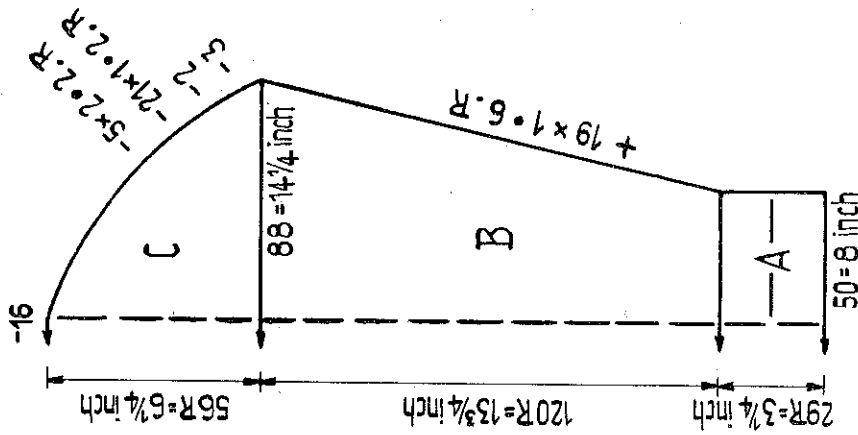

Boy's sweater with cable stitch

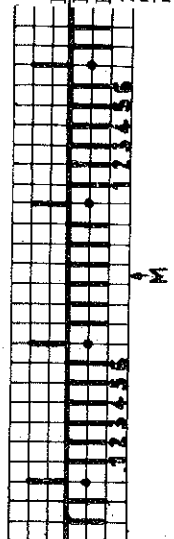
Size: for 11 to 12 years. Materials: approx. 14 ozs medium

Shetland wool dark blue

Stitch size: 1:1 welts 4, pattern back 5 / front 6 1/2, st.st. 6 1/2

Test square: 100 sts = 16 1/4 ins. 100 rows = 11 1/2 ins.

Pattern: M = centre of front.



Back: N

Front: N

Knit 6 rows, then put 1st,

2nd and 3rd sts onto 4th,

5th and 6th nds, and 4th,

5th and 6th sts onto 1st,

2nd and 3rd nds.

Figure I: A = 1:1. B, C and D = stocking stitch.  
 Figure II: A = 1:1. B = pattern. C = divide work, for neck shaping put the 13th st onto the 12th nd and follow up with the remaining 12 sts. D = pattern.  
 Figure III: A = 1:1. B = st.st., cable over the 8 centre sts. C = st.st. with cable stitch.  
 Neckborder: Cast on 126 sts in 1:1 and knit 5 rows. Now bring all nds into W.P. and hang into the empty nds of front bed the cross link of each opposite st. Knit 2 rows tubular, then at front and back 2 rows stocking stitch each. With contrast wool knit 2 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K, then release.  
 To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Stitch neckborder into position, first outside st by st with back stitch, unravelling contrast wool, then slip stitch inside. Mitre front centre.

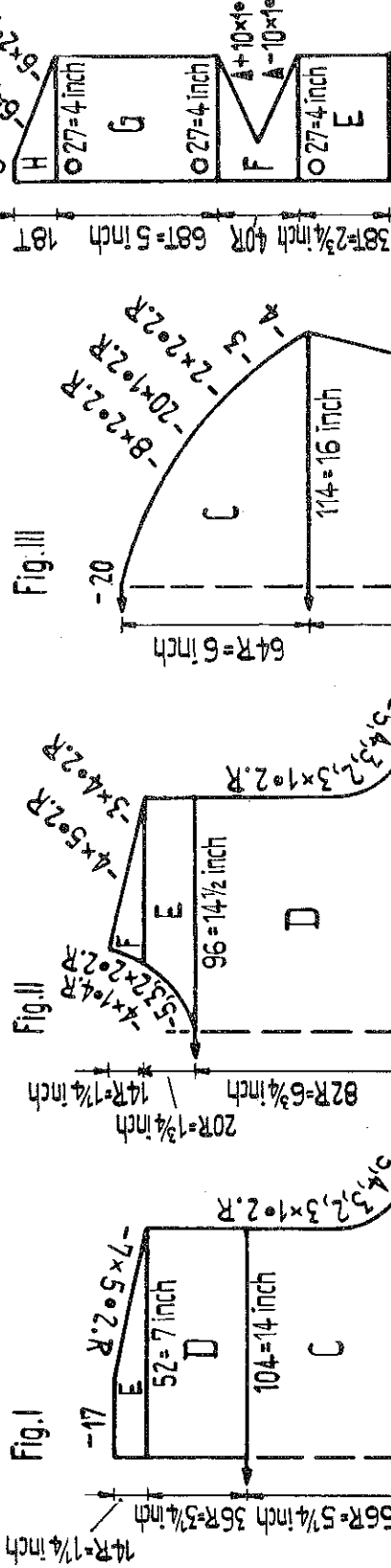

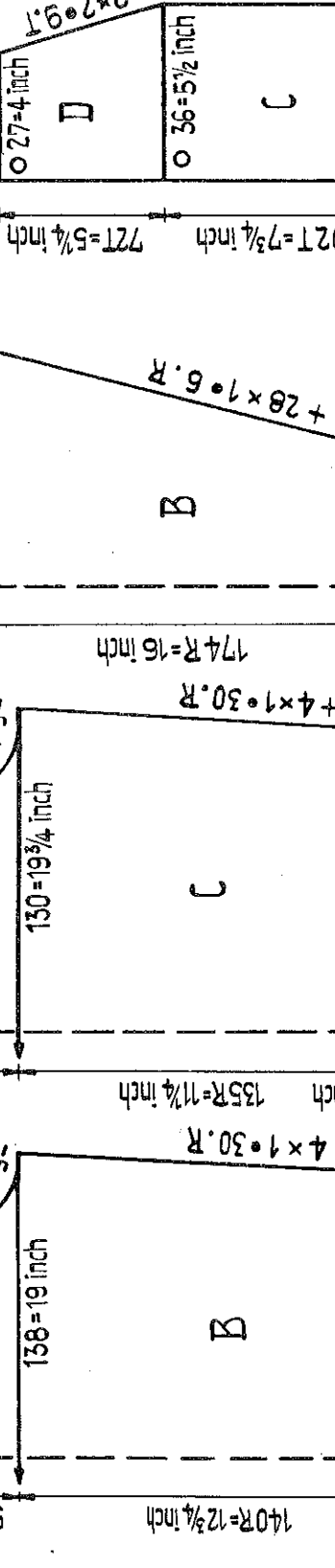

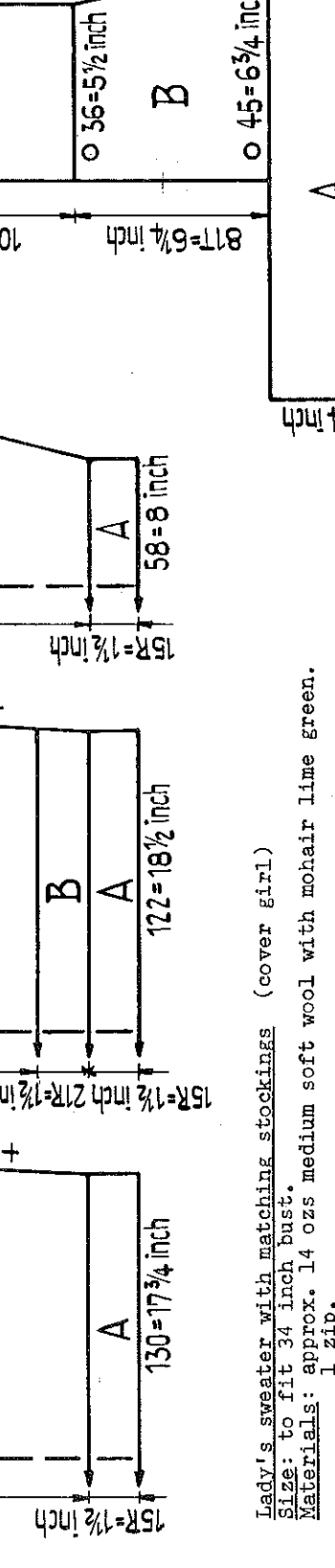

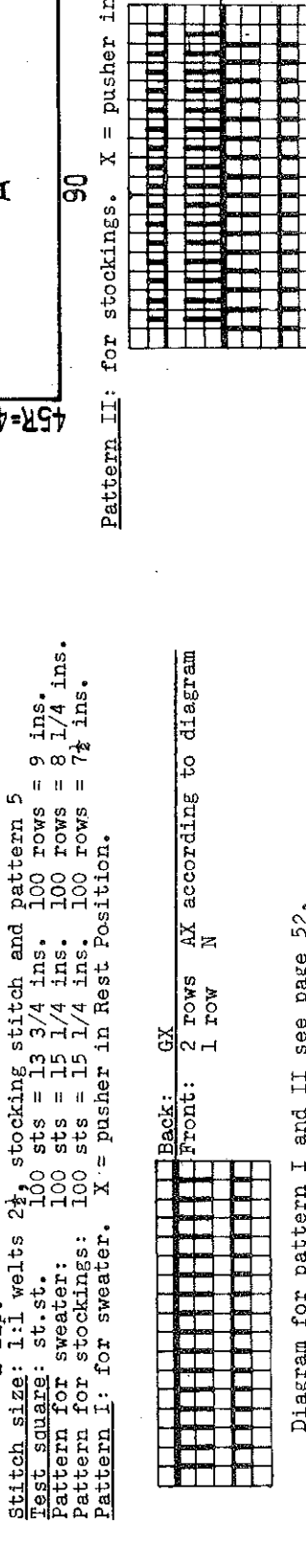
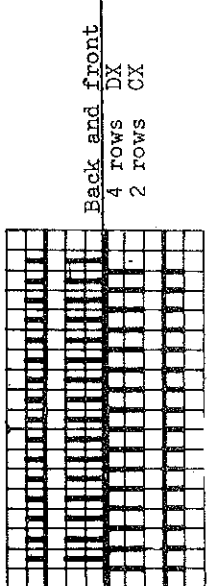


Figure I: A = 1:1. B = st.st. C and D = pattern. E = divide work, st.st. B = st.st. F = pattern. Figure II: A = 1:1. B = st.st. C and D = pattern. E = divide work, st.st. B = st.st. F = pattern. Figure III: A = 1:1. B and C = stocking stitch. D = divide work, st.st. B = st.st. F = pattern. Figure IV: A = 1:1. B = pattern II, arrange for pattern on a few rows, then release. Neckborder: Cast on 100 sts in 1:1 and knit 16 rows. With contrast wool knit front and back bed. F = knit a few rows with contrast wool, then release. Hang back all sts to the machine, watching that the deer. For the calfs are in the centre of front bed, make heel, stocking stitch. G = back bed with pattern, front bed with stocking stitch. H = tubular. To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. With part side to outside. Stitch neckborder into position, then fold in half and slip stitch inside. Around back opening crochet 1 row of firm stitches and set in zip. Join borders of stockings.

Pattern II: for stockings. X = pusher in Rest Position.



Lady's sweater with matching stockings (cover girl)  
 Size: to fit 34 inch bust.  
 Materials: approx. 14 ozs medium soft wool with mohair lime green. 1 zip.  
 Stitch size: 1:1 welts 2 1/2, stocking stitch and pattern 5  
 Test square: st.st. 100 sts = 13 3/4 ins. 100 rows = 9 ins.  
 Pattern for sweater: 100 sts = 15 1/4 ins. 100 rows = 8 1/4 ins.  
 Pattern for stockings: 100 sts = 15 1/4 ins. 100 rows = 7 1/2 ins.  
 Pattern I: for sweater. X = pusher in Rest Position.

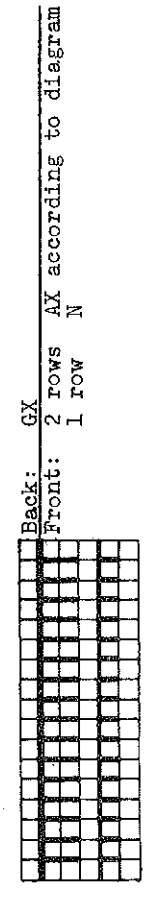


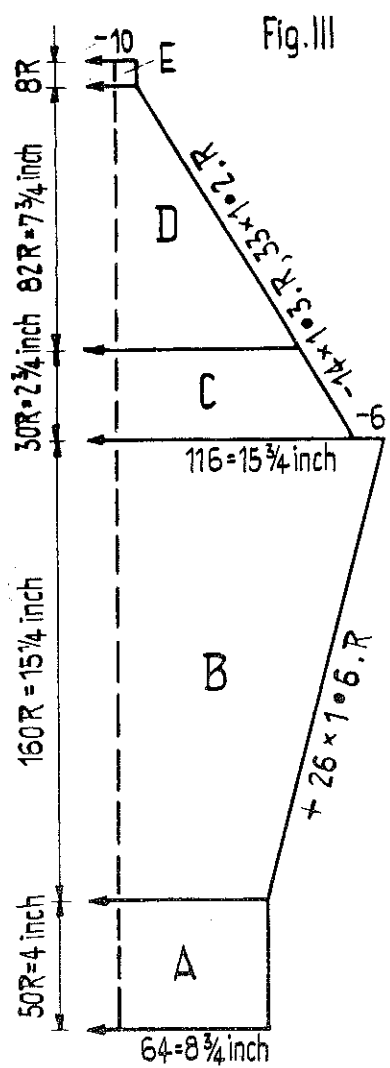

 Figure III: A = 1:1. B = st.st., thereby after 8 rows knit the red, after 34 rows the black, after 60 rows the green, after 86 rows the red, after 112 rows the black, after 138 rows the green fairisle dotted rows according to diagram 1. C = st.st. with raglan shaping, after 4 rows knit the red dotted rows according to diagram 1. D = fairisle according to diagram 2. E = st.st. in red.  
 Figure XII: cap. Knit twice. Pattern II. Take the remaining sts onto contrast wool.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press lightly, using hot iron over damp cloth. Join seams. Fold neckborder to inside fix with loose sts. Cap. Stitch the 2 parts together and pull the top sts together. Around lower edge sew a ribbon and fold to inside.
