A baby book for the PASSAP DUOMATIC has been planned for some time, and now we are proud to say : here it is !

We have had a good many requests to reprint some very popular patterns from earlier PASSAP books which are now out of print, so we have added these to the wide range of new baby knits, all of them complete with up-to-date knitting instructions, ranging from new-born babies up to four-year-olds.

In this book you will find jackets, pants, dresses, sweaters and rompers of various types with - we hope - something to suit all tastes. Two models will prove particularly useful : leggings Number 2063 and socks Number 2074, both of which are given in four sizes.

We have not included our usual wool chart, because baby wools are the same in most countries. But for your guidance we have included some notes about the number of metres per 100 gr (or yards per ounce) and on page 23 you will find a small chart on this subject.

We do hope you will enjoy using the PASSAP BABY BOOK.

Before starting your work please study carefully the explanations given on pages 1 and 2

Patterns: The drawings refer to half width, the indications of stitch numbers refer to whole width of each part.

Figure I = back
Figure II = front
Figure III = sleeve
Figure IV = collar
Figure V = border, cuff
Figure VI = pocket
Figure VII = skirt, front
Figure VIII = skirt, back

Figure IX = pants
Figure X = gusset
Figure XI = scarf
Figure XII = cap, bonnet
Figure XIII = mittens
Figure XIV = socks, stockings
Figure XV = straps
Figure XVI = bra, halter, bodice, top

If the centre line of the half width is dotted and shows arrows, the other half is worked simultaneously with reversed shapings, i. e. decreasing or increasing is made on the left as well as on the right side.

If the centre line is drawn in one firm line, the other half is worked separately with reversed shapings, i. e. first knit one part according to diagram (increasing or decreasing at right), then the second part the opposite way (decreasing or increasing at left).

Stitches are only given by a number (without accompanying letter "st"). The stitch number always refers to the total of stitches, i. e. to all needles which are in Working Position on back and front bed.

Exception: For tubular or half tubular the necessary stitches are only given for one bed. The same number of needles must therefore be put into Working Position on the other bed. In these cases the sign for tubular  respectively (or) for half tubular is set before the relevant stitch number.

Examples for increasing and decreasing:

First increase or decrease always occurs in the first row of a section.

- $+3 \times 2 \cdot 8.R$ means: increase 2 stitches 3 times in every 8th row (1 stitch at back, 1 stitch at front).
- $-19 \times 3 \cdot 7.R$ means: decrease 3 stitches 19 times in every 7th row (back 2 stitches, front 1 stitch or vice versa).
- $-17 \times 1 \cdot 2./3.R$ means: decrease 1 stitch 17 times, alternately once after 2 rows and once after 3 rows.
- $\blacktriangle -4 \times 8 \cdot 2.R$ means: work graduations, i. e. short rows (on DUO with pushers and lock BX). Step by step put 8 nds (and their respective pushers) into Rest Position 4 times after every 2nd row (for double bed 4 nds each back and front). Once all graduations are finished, continue knitting normally, i. e. all nds in Working Position (pushers in Neutral Position).

Graduations can be knitted two ways, either from outer edge towards centre (gradual decreasing with the minus-sign "-" after the black triangle) or from the centre towards outer edge (gradual increasing with the plus-sign "+" after the black triangle.)

Number of stitches and centimetres :

- $136 = 20\text{cm}$ means: a total of 136 sts (for K/K 68 stitches each on back and front) make a width of 20 cm.
- $\bigcirc 146 = 43\text{cm}$ means: cast on 146 sts each on back and front bed for tubular which makes a width of 43 cm.

Stitch size: These indications are only recommended by us. They must always be tested by you, by making your own test square for your own wool.

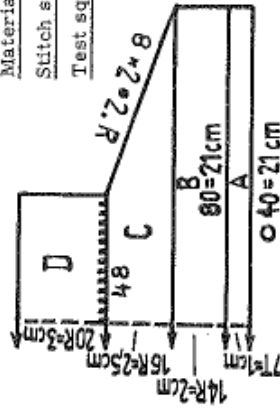
Test square: We strongly recommend that you make always a test square with your own material before starting to work, in order to calculate for your material the necessary numbers of stitches and rows along the PASSAP - chart. The chapter "The test square and its calculation" in your instruction book informs you how to proceed for these calculations. This is very important, especially when adjusting a model to another size.

Size: 1 to 6 months
Material: about 1 1/2 ozs medium baby wool
Stitch size: 3 1/2
Test square: 100 sts = 26 cm (10 1/4"),
100 rows = 14 cm (5 1/2")



Material: 340 metres per 100 gr
approx. 97 yards per 1 oz
10 cm = approx. 4"

Fig. XIV: A = tubular; make zig-zag with St. S 1. With St. S 2 knit 2 rows tubular, change to St. S 3 and knit another 2 rows tubular. Further rows tubular with St. S 4 B = fisherman's rib EX/EX. C = fisherman's rib. Decrease with double decker tool. D = Work 1 row of holes, then fisherman's rib N/EX, cast off.

To make up:

Sew up. Make twisted or knitted cord and thread through holes at ankles.

TIPS

How to make an open work row when knitting 1:1 rib, using transfer lock U 70:
For last row before open work row set St. S on back bed about 1 1/2 sizes larger than normal. Knit 1 row, rack 1 1/4 nds to left, transfer sts to front bed, rack 1 1/4 nds to right, leaving empty nds in W. P. Continue with normal St. S.

Tubular knitted cord:

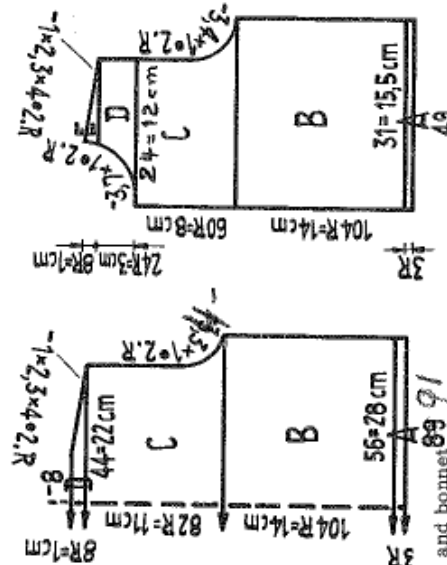
With 3 (2 front, 1 back) 4 or 5 nds and lock set on CX/CX knit cord of desired length.

Uneven number of sts (3, 5, 7) = round cord.

Even number of sts (2, 4, 6) = flat cord.

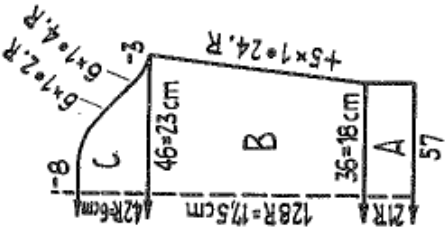

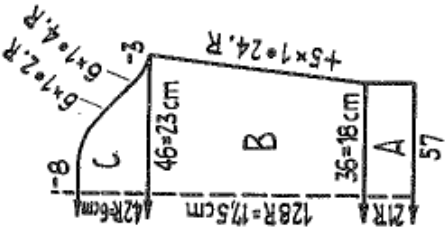

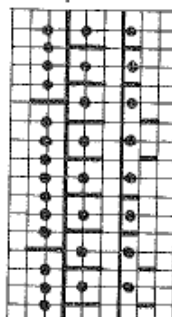
Fig. I, II, III: A = 1:1 rib. Transfer sts for pattern I. B, C, D + E = knit in pattern I.

Fig. XII: A = 1:1 rib. Transfer sts for pattern I. B = knit in pattern I. C = with St. S 3/2 and lock on N/N knit 8 rows. D = change to St. S 1 1/2, transfer sts for pattern II and knit 8 rows, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

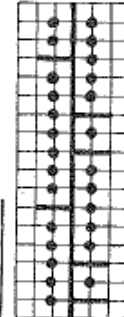
Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Sew up jacket. Work 1 row of single crochet along front edges and round neck, then 1 row of double crochet round neck. Thread knitted or twisted cord through the double crochet. Gather sts of section D of bonnet, unravelling contrast yarn. Join back seam along 6 cm. Work 1 row of single crochet round outer edge. Sew on ribbon.

Fig. 1: A = knit tubular, then 1 row K/K. B, C and D = pattern 1.

Fig. II: A = knit tubular, then 1 row K/K. B = counting from front edge, transfer 27 sts for pattern 2, remaining nds in pattern 1. C = pattern 1 and 2.

Here make either on left or on right front 3 buttonholes over sts 6 to 8. D = knit in pattern 1 and 2. E = knit in pattern 1.

Fig. III: A = K/K, B and C = pattern 1.

Fig. IV: A = knit tubular, at both ends put 22 sts on a thread (11 sts on each bed). With 96 sts knit 1 row K/K. B = knit in pattern 1. change to St. S.3 and knit 2 rows

K/K. C = on back bed knit 4 rows stocking st, a few rows with contrast wool, the same on front bed. release.

Fig. XII: Bonnet. A = knit tubular, then 1 row K/K. B = knit in pattern I, AX and pushers on back bed, then change to St. S 3 and knit 4 rows K/K.

C = knit in pattern I, AX and pushers on front bed. At both ends put 44 sts on thread. D = knit in pattern I, cast off.

Neck band: For tubular cast on 42 sts on each bed and knit 12 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Sew up jacket, Sew loose sts on thread to side edges of collar. Sew on collar starting and ending at centre of pattern 2 stripes. Neaten buttonholes, sew on buttons. Bonnet: Sew loose sts on thread to edges of section D. Sew on neck band. Secure ribbon at front.

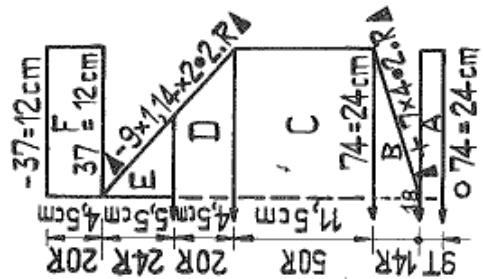

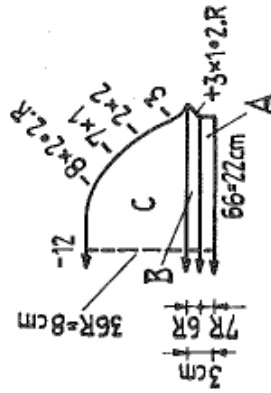

Neck band: Back of neck: With St. S 2 and 22 sts, cast on and knit 4 rows in 1:1 rib. Put all nds in working position and knit 8 rows tubular with St. S 412.

A few rows tubular with contrast yarn, release. Front of neck: Cast on 44 sts and knit as for back.

FIG.1a, back : A = 6 rows tubular, then knit 6 rows on back bed and 6 rows on front bed. Transfer all sts to front bed. B = continue in stocking st, making graduations starting from the inside. C = knit in stocking st. D = make graduations starting from the outside (leg shaping). E = divide work with BX and pushers, then continue in stocking st. At right shape leg. F = for leg band knit stocking st over all nds. For other leg knit sections E and F reversing shapings.

Fig. IXb, front : A = 6 rows tubular, then knit 6 rows on back bed and 6 rows on front bed. Transfer all sts to front bed. B = stocking st. C = leg shaping : 12 graduations starting from the outside. D = divide work, at right shape leg. E = for leg band knit stocking st over all nds. For other leg repeat sections D and E reversing shapings.

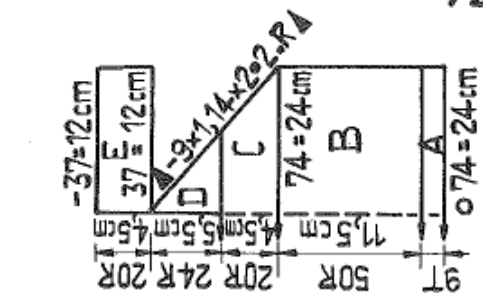
Gusset: Cast on 3 sts and knit 48 rows, increasing 1 st at both ends every alternate row, 11 times. Then decrease 1 st every alternate row, 11 times: Cast off.

To make up: Pin out parts to size and press. Sew up.

Sweater: Sew on neck band first to outside, st by st with back st, then to inside st by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Work a row of single crochet along shoulder openings, making 4 button loops at front. At back, sew on buttons to match.

Pants : Set in gusset. Fold leg band in half to inside. At waist insert elastic.

Baby's jacket and bonnet

Size: about 5 months

Material: 7 ozs medium baby wool, 3 small buttons 1 yard ribbon

Stitch size: tubular 6, pattern 5

Test square: 100 sts = 43 cm (17"), 100 rows = 13 cm (5 1/8")

Pattern:

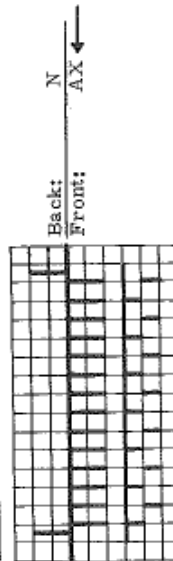


Fig. I: A = knit tubular. B to D = knit in pattern.

Fig. II: Knit first front according to diagram

A = knit tubular, B = knit in pattern. C = continue in pattern. In the 1st, 30th and 60th row make a buttonhole over sts 3, 4 and 5. D to E = in pattern. Knit second front with reversed shapings and without buttonholes.

Fig. III: A = knit tubular. B and C = knit in pattern.

Fig. IV, collar: A = 4 rows tubular, 4 rows stocking st on back bed and 4 rows on front bed. B = at each end knit 30 sts (15 on front and 15 on back bed) with contrast yarn and release. With remaining 50 sts continue in pattern. C = on back bed knit 5 rows stocking st, then 5 rows on front bed, with contrast yarn knit 4 rows stocking st tubular, and 2 rows K/K, release.

Fig. XII, bonnet: A = knit tubular. B and C = knit in pattern. Cast off.

Front borders: Make two.

With 60 sts cast on for tubular and knit 12 rows stocking st tubular followed by 4 rows tubular and 2 rows K/K with contrast yarn, release.

Band for bonnet: With 50 sts knit as for front border.

To make up:

Block and press all parts lightly. Sew up. Sew on front borders, first to outside, then to inside, st by st with back st, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew side edgings to collar. Sew collar to neck, starting and ending at centre of front borders, unravelling contrast yarn. Neaten buttonholes, sew on buttons. On bonnet sew the 29 cast-off sts of section B to shaped edges of section C. Sew on band same way as front bands. Lastly, sew on ribbons.

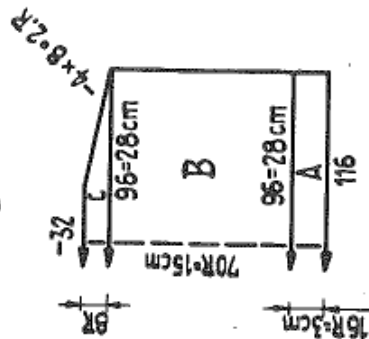
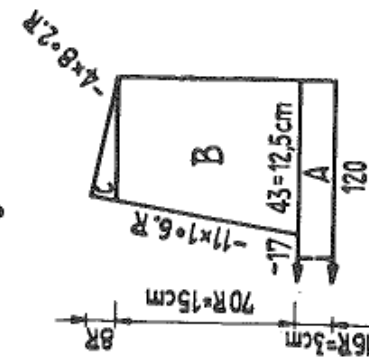

Size: 5 to 6 months

Material: 2 1/2 ozs baby wool, 64" ribbon

Stitch size: borders 3, pattern back 4 1/2, front 5

Test square: 100 sts = 28, 5 cm (11 1/4"), 100 rows = 21, 5 cm (8 1/2")

Pattern:

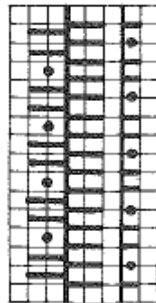


Fig. I: A = knit in K/K. B and C = knit in pattern.

Fig. II: A = knit in K/K. B = divide work in the centre put 17 sts on a thread, knit in pattern, C = knit in pattern. Repeat sections B and C, reversing shapings. Front band: Put 17 sts on thread back on to machine and knit 190 rows in K/K. Cast off.

Armhole bands: Knit two. Cast on 11 sts and knit 140 rows in K/K, cast off.

To make up:

Block and press all parts lightly. Join shoulder seam, sew on armhole bands. Sew on front band. Fold waist band in half to inside and catch down. Pull ribbon through hem and tie at both sides.

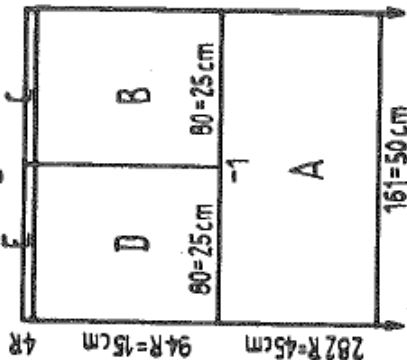

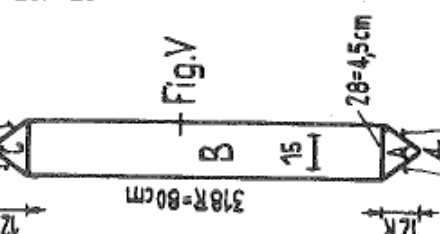
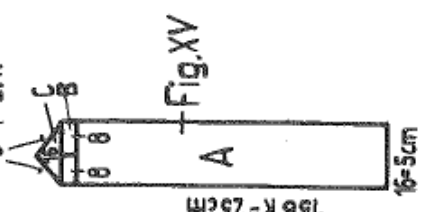

Baby's sleeping bag

Size: with straps about 77 cm long and 50 cm wide

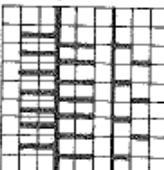
Material: 14 ozs medium baby wool (English 4-ply): 8 ozs white and 8 ozs pale blue, 2 yds ribbon, 2 buttons

Stitch size: pattern 4, K/K 3

Test square: 100 sts = 31 cm (12 1/4"), 100 rows = 16 cm (6 1/4")

Pattern:

Handle down, pink strippers



Back: N
Front: 2 rows N pale blue
4 rows AX O white

Material: 340 metres length per 100 gr approx. 106 yds per 1 oz
10 cm = approx. 4"

Fig. II, front: A = knit in pattern. B = put one half of sts on a thread (front opening), continue in pattern. C = pale blue, on back bed knit 4 rows stocking st, cast off. Repeat on front bed. D and E = put sts of other half back on to ends of machine and knit as for sections B and C.

Back: knit as front (Fig. II), omitting front opening.

Fig. V: Waistband. A = pale blue, K/K. Increase inside edge st. B = K/K after the 58th row make a buttonhole over sts 7 to 22. C = K/K, decrease with double decker tool.

Fig. XV, strap: A = knit in pattern. B = divide work for buttonhole. C = knit in pattern.

To make up:

Pin out parts to size and press lightly. Sew up. Sew waist band between the 4 rows stocking st at waist, starting at centre back, easing in fullness of main part to about 66 cm. Sew straps to back, sew on buttons at front, neaten buttonholes. Sew ribbon to points of waist band, take ribbon through buttonholes. Cross and tie ribbon.

Outfit, consisting of jacket, bonnet and rompers

Size : 8 to 12 months

Material: 12 ozs medium wool, 14 small buttons, 1 yard ribbon

Stitch size: Pattern 4, stocking st 5½, 1:1 rib = 2 ¾

Test square: 100 sts = 31 cm (12 $\frac{1}{4}$ "), 100 rows = 16 cm (6 $\frac{1}{4}$ ")

Pattern: Entire outfit in honeycomb pattern according to diagram, borders in stocking st, stocking st tubular and 1:1 rib.

Jacket

Fig. 1: A = knit straight in pattern, B = continue in pattern, decreasing at both ends. C = transfer sts to back bed for stocking st and knit in stocking st, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Fig. II: One front. A = as for Fig. I. B = at right knit straight, at left decrease.

C = at right cast off 4 sts, transfer sts to back bed, knit a few rows stocking st with contrast yarn. release.

Knit other front in the same way, reversing shapings.

Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib. B = knit straight in pattern. C = continue in pattern, decreasing 1 st at both ends. D = transfer sts to back bed, knit a few rows stocking st with contrast yarn. release.

To make up jacket:

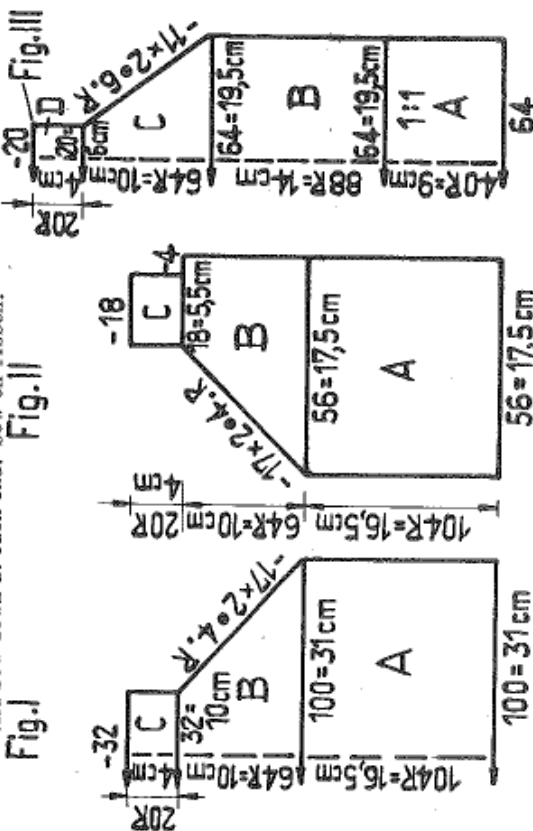
Block and press all parts. Sew up. Fold neck band in half to inside and sew down at center. Sew yoke and collar to body. Sew yoke and collar into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. At front sew on 4 small buttons. Button through pattern of other front edge. Press seams.

Bonnet

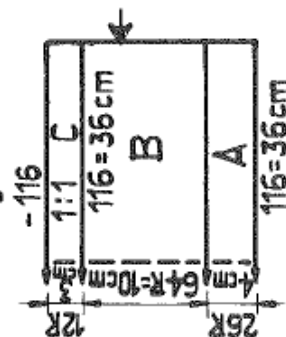
Fig. XII: A = border : knit in pattern, but with lock set at back on AX $\frac{1}{2}$, at front on N. B = continue in pattern according to diagram. C = 1:1 rib, puts on a strong thread.

To make up bonnet :

Draw up and fasten off. Join edges along section C to arrow. Fold pattern border to outside and sew down at each end. Sew on ribbon.

Contrary to needle rule, put one more into W.P. at left back, in order to obtain a neat edge.

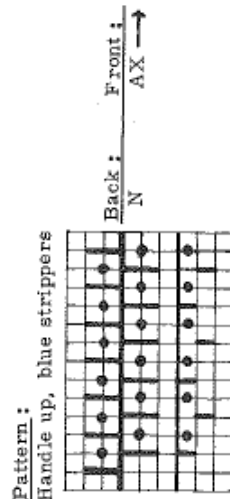
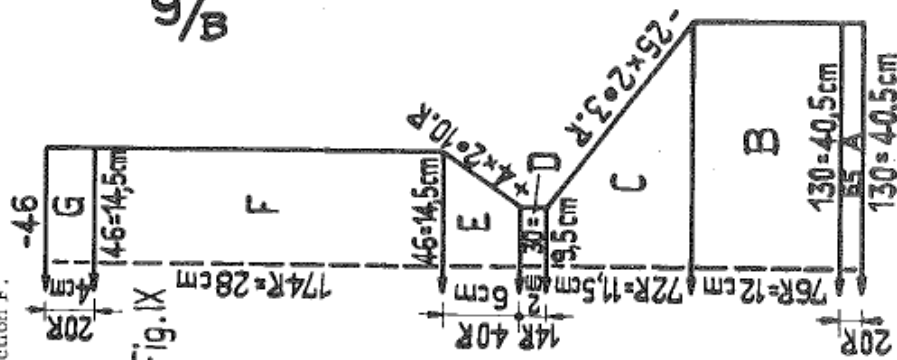

Material: 350 metres length per 100 gr approx. 110 yards per 1 oz
10 cm = approx. $\frac{4}{8}$ "

Pattern :

Handle up, blue strippers

To make up :

Press all parts lightly. Fold top of bib in half to inside (section C) and sew down, but not at by st, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew one small button to each top corner of bib. Sew straps to centre back of waist hem (section A) (straps will be buttoned to bib). Sew on leg bands along sections C, D and E, first outside, then inside, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. At both sides, along sections A and B sew on 4 small buttons. Fold up bib, placing section B on top of section F. Take buttons of sections A and B through pattern of section F.

Romper's

Fig. IX: Begin at waist back: A = waist hem; with St. S 1 make zig-zag in 141 over 130 nds. Set lock at back on GX, at front on N. With 65 nds on front bed knit 18 rows. Last row (Rt 20) with lock set on N/N, St. S 4. B = knit straight in pattern. C = decrease at both ends. D = knit straight. E = increase at both ends. F = bib. Knit straight in pattern. G = transfer sts to back bed, knit stocking st at back, then a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Straps (make two): With 6 sts on each bed knit 160 rows in stocking st (RC 160)

Then make buttonhole thus : At front and back place centre st onto next st, leaving empty nds in W. P. Knit 2 rows tubular. Pick up thread, twist and place on empty nds. Shape point, decreasing 1 st every alternate row. front and back.

Leg band (make two): Make zig-zag over 80 nds and knit 18 rows tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn. release.

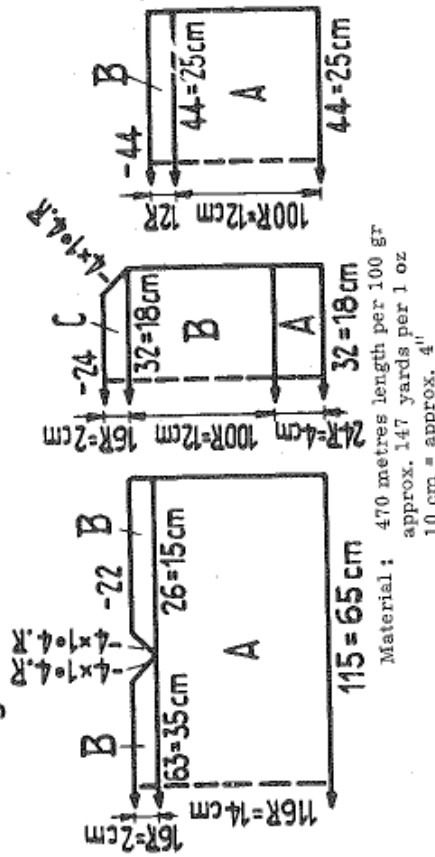

Baby's jacket with bonnet

Size: about 4 to 6 months
Material: 4 1/2 ozs baby wool (English 3-ply), 2 yds ribbon, 4 yds lace
Pattern: pattern 4 1/2, stocking st 5, 1:1 rib 2 1/2
Stitch size: pattern: 100 sts = 57 cm (22 1/2"), 100 rows = 12 cm (4 3/4")
Test square: pattern: 100 sts = 57 cm (22 1/2"), 100 rows = 12 cm (4 3/4")
Pattern:

Back:	GX
3 rows AX	O
1 row N	→

Fig. I and II: A = knit in pattern. B = at left put 89 sts on thread. With remaining 26 sts knit first half of back in pattern. Cast off. For centre panel place 63 sts back on to nds and knit in pattern according to diagram. Cast off. Place remaining 26 sts back on to nds of machine and knit second half of back as first, reversing shapings.
Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib. B and C = continue in pattern, put all sts on thread.
Yoke: First place sts of left back, sleeve, centre panel, other sleeve and lastly right back onto nds of machine, reducing number of sts to 121. Knit 36 rows in stocking st, cast off.
Fig. XII, bonnet: A = knit in pattern. B = continue in stocking st. Put all sts on a thread.

To make up:
 Block and press all parts lightly. Jacket: Sew up. Work 1 row of single crochet round outer edge of jacket, 1 row of double crochet round neck. Fold ribbed cuffs in half to inside and sew down. Sew on lace and pull ribbon through holes at neck.
 Bonnet: Draw up sts on thread and fasten off. Make a 5 cm seam. Work 1 row of single crochet round bonnet, easing in at lower edge. Sew on lace around front edge. Sew on ribbon.

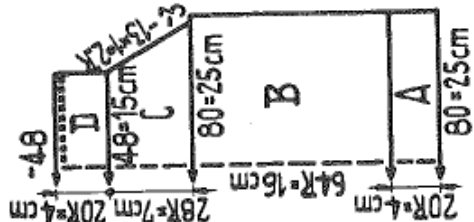
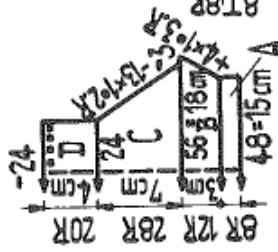

Size: about 1 1/2 to 2 years
Material: about 7 ozs baby wool (English 4-ply) some ribbon and elastic
Pattern: stocking st
Stitch size: 1:1 rib = 3, stocking st = 5 1/2, tubular = 5
Test square: 100 sts = 32 cm (12 5/8"), 100 rows = 25 1/2 cm (10")

Fig. I and II: A = 1:1 rib. B = stocking st. C = stocking st, raglan shaping with triple decker tool. D = 1:1 rib, after 16 rows make one open work row.
Fig. III: A = 1:1 rib. B = stocking st. C = raglan shaping with triple decker tool. D = 1:1 rib, after 16 rows make one open work row.
Fig. IXa, back: A = knit 4 rows stocking st tubular, then knit 8 rows stocking st, first at back, then at front. B = stocking st with graduations starting from the inside. C = stocking st. D = stocking st, making graduations, starting from outer edge for leg shaping. Put remaining 20 sts on a thread. E = stocking st.
Fig. IXb, front: Knit in the same way as back, reversing shapings and omitting graduations at waist.

To make up:
 Block and press all parts lightly. Sew up.
 Sweater: Pull ribbon through holes at neck.
 Pants: Graft loose sts on a thread together. Fold leg band in half to inside and catch down. Insert elastic.

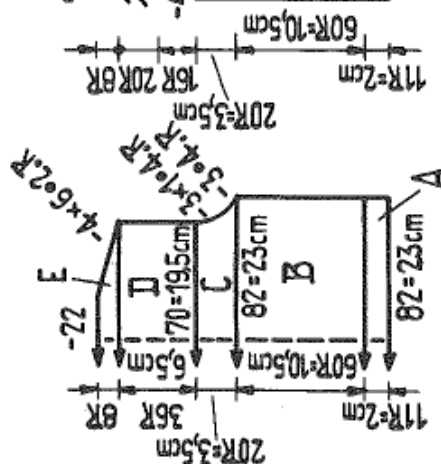
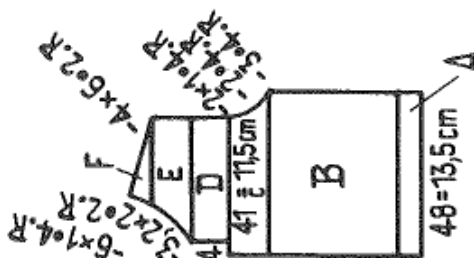

Size: 1 1/2 to 2 years

Material: 9 ozs fine synthetic yarn; 5 1/2 ozs white, 3 1/2 ozs turquoise, 6 small buttons

Stitch size: Pattern 3 1/2, stocking st 4

Wool is hygroscopic (absorbing humidity)

This means that in a damp climate there will be fewer metres per 100 gr, whereas in a dry climate there will surely be more metres per 100 gr. Therefore, any statement concerning the length of a yarn per 100 gr can be no more than an indication of the length measured before the yarn leaves the spinning mill.

The knitted test square alone will show whether you have chosen the right material.

Keep a note book and write down your experiences about test squares, stitch sizes and number of yards or metres per 100 gr or 1 ounce. These notes will come in handy before starting to knit a new model.

100 sts = 38 cm (15"), 100 rows (RC 200) = 14 cm (5 1/2")

Pattern:

In pattern according to diagrams 1 and 2, starting at top. Legs and main part tubular

Material: 360 metres length per 100 gr approx. 113 yards per 1 oz

10 cm = approx. 4"

Fig. IX + XIV: A and B = knit once on back bed with lock set on AX ↔ at back and GX at front, and once on front bed with lock set on GX at back and AX ↔ at front, according to pattern 1. Leave sts on machine.

A = top hem knit straight. B = increase at both ends. At both ends cast off 3 sts for turn-in at armhole. C = continue tubular according to pattern 2. At left back put 1 additional nd into W.P. (back bed 72 nds, front bed 71 nds)

Knit straight until row counter shows RC 100, then knit 4 rows CX/CX (RC 8)

D = continue straight until row counter shows RC 272. Note pusher position.

Front and back cast off 11 centre sts. At left back put 31 sts, front 30 sts on dekercombs and let them hang between the bds. E = knit right leg according to pattern 2 and diagram. At left back put 1 additional nd into W.P. (back bed 31 sts, front bed 30 sts). At right continue straight, at left front and back decrease with single deker. F and G = heel. At back set lock on GX, press zero

keys, on front bed continue with BX and pushers. H = knit tubular in pattern 2, continue straight. J = at both ends, back and front, decrease 1 st every 4th row. Put last sts on thread, draw up and fasten off.

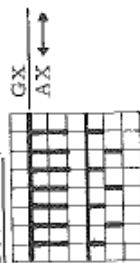
For left leg place sts on dekercombs back on to nds of machine and repeat sections E to J, reversing shapings.

Strap (make two): With 7 sts on back and 6 sts on front bed knit 100 rows tubular (RC 100) in pattern 2. For buttonhole in the centre knit 2 sts on front bed and 3 sts on back bed with contrast yarn by hand, then 5 rows tubular (RC 5). Shape Point decreasing 1 st back and front, every 6th RC-rows.

To make up:

Turn leggings and straps inside out. Graft the 11 cast-off sts at crutch together. At waist (between sections C and D) insert elastic. Sew section A and the 3 cast-off sts to inside. Neaten buttonhole on straps, unravelling contrast yarn. Sew straps to back, sew on buttons on front.

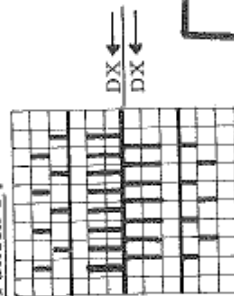
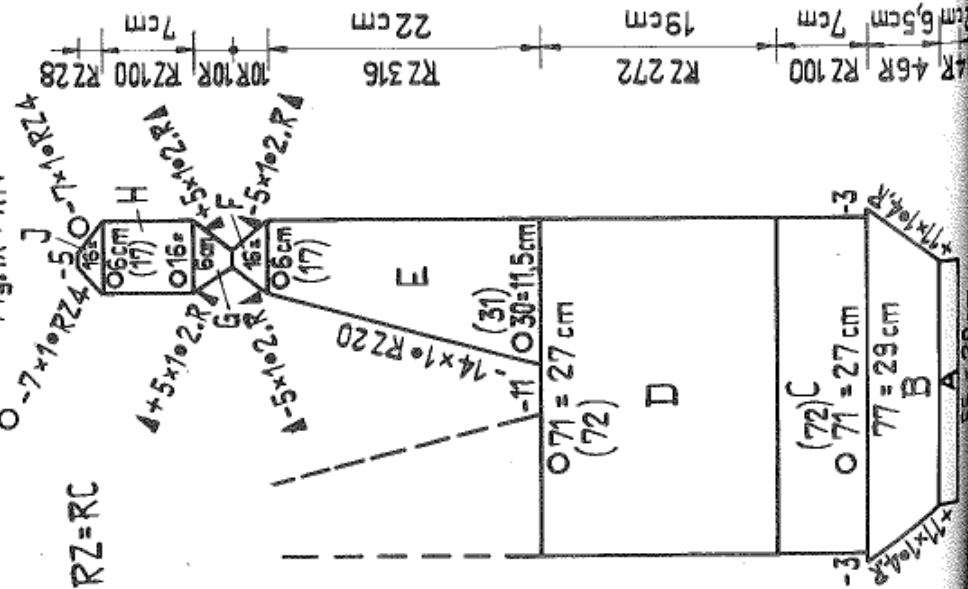

Fig. I: Right back according to diagram

A = cast on and knit 30 rows straight then decrease as follows: at right move 1 st 1 nd inwards using triple deker tool (there will be 2 sts on 3rd nd). With 24 dekercomb move 24 sts 1 nd inwards. At right return 2 nds to N.P. Knit 14 rows straight. Make second decreasing as before but with 23 sts etc. etc. B = at right armhole shaping, then straight, at left knit straight. C = at right shape shoulder, cast off.

Knit left back with reversed shapings.

Fig. II: A = after 30 rows decrease at both ends as for Fig. I. B = shape armholes, then continue straight. C = divide work with BX and pushers. Cast off centre 8 sts. Knit first shoulder according to diagram: at right knit straight, at left shape neck. D = at right shape shoulder, at left knit straight.

Complete second shoulder with reversed shapings.

Pocket: With 33 sts knit 38 rows straight, cast off.

To make up:

Block and press all parts. Join side and shoulder seams. With red crochet along outer edge and armholes as follows: Foundation row: single crochet. Second row: * chain st and 3 double crochet into first st of foundation row, miss 3 sts *. Repeat from * to *. Work crochet edging round pocket and sew pocket to front. Sew 3 small buttons to one side of centre back opening. Take buttons through

Fig. I, back: A = cast on with racking. With turquoise knit 2 rows K/K, then change to main colour (white) and knit in pattern throughout. At both ends decrease. B = shape shoulders with triple decker tool according to diagram, i.e. *decrease 2 sts, knit 2 rows, decrease 2 sts, knit 2 rows, decrease 4 sts, knit 2 rows *. Repeat from *to* 5 times. Cast off.

Fig. II, front: A = cast on as for Fig. I, continue with white in pattern. At right decrease, at left knit straight. B = at right shape shoulder with triple decker tool, at left shape neck. Work last three decreases for shoulder shaping from left to right side according to diagram.

Work right front according to diagram, starting with second pattern series.

Fig. IV, collar: Cast on as for Fig. I, then continue with white in pattern. B = with contrast yarn knit over 24 sts at both ends, release. Continue straight on remaining 106 sts. C = stocking st tubular, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

Border for centre front (make two): With 140 sts and turquoise cast on as for Fig. I. With white knit 6 rows in pattern, 2 rows N/N, a few rows with contrast yarn, release.

To make up:

Do not press. Join side seams. At centre front sew on borders, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. At collar sew on released sts from point * to arrow, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Sew collar to neck, leaving half of front borders free, first outside then inside, backstitching into the open loops and unravelling contrast yarn. Sew on press stud at top of front borders.

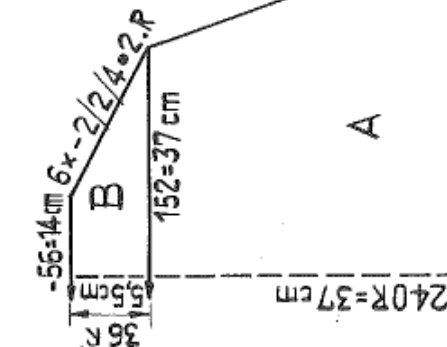

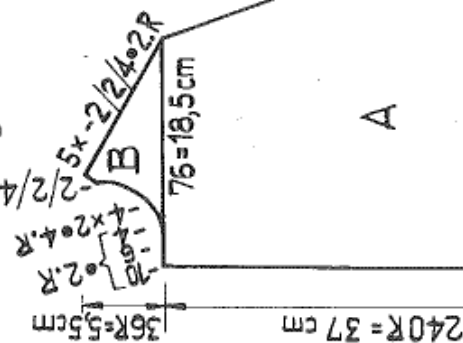
